Tournament Notes:

The 2011 Aspen Sports Treebash Open is a PDGA B-Tier event, and an Arizona Disc Golf Club Cactus Series event. This year will be the 13th annual Treebash tournament. Our title Sponsor, Aspen Sports, is a full-service outdoor gear and accessory store with a complete disc golf selection. Aspen Sports has supported the sport of disc golf for many years, and recently donated nine of the baskets at the McPherson Park Disc Golf Course, along with the Arizona Disc Golf Club donating the other half.

Notes on Flagstaff and playing at Elevation:

For those not accustomed to playing at elevation, a little advice goes a long way: Oxygen in the air is thin, so pacing yourself is mandatory. The humidity levels are also quite low, so keeping hydrated is essential. The UV levels from the sun are very high, so the use of sunscreen is suggested. In the mountains, weather can be very unpredictable, so keeping a rainjacket and an extra layer is suggested.

Flagstaff is located in Northern Arizona on the southern edge of the Colorado Plateau. Nestled in Ponderosa pine forest at the base of an extinct volcano, the town is situated at an elevation of 7000 ft. The local disc golf courses are carved out of the dense, rocky pine forest that dominates the landscape, creating short, technical holes that require accuracy and finesse.

Tournament Rules:

All PDGA rules will be enforced. Certified Officials will be at all courses. The two meter rule **will** be in effect, so any disc coming to rest 2 meters above the playing surface will be considered out-of-bounds according to PDGA rule 803.09 (printed on back page). Alcohol consumption **will not** be permitted during tournament play. Consumption of alcohol in non-glass containers by those who are 21 and over **will** be permitted at McPherson Park during times of non-tournament rounds. There is to be no consumption of alcoholic beverages at the NAU course. There will be **NO SMOKING** on any of the courses during any of the rounds due to current fire restrictions. Any player caught smoking and/or consuming alcohol during tournament rounds will be immediately disqualified and reported to the PDGA and local authorities.

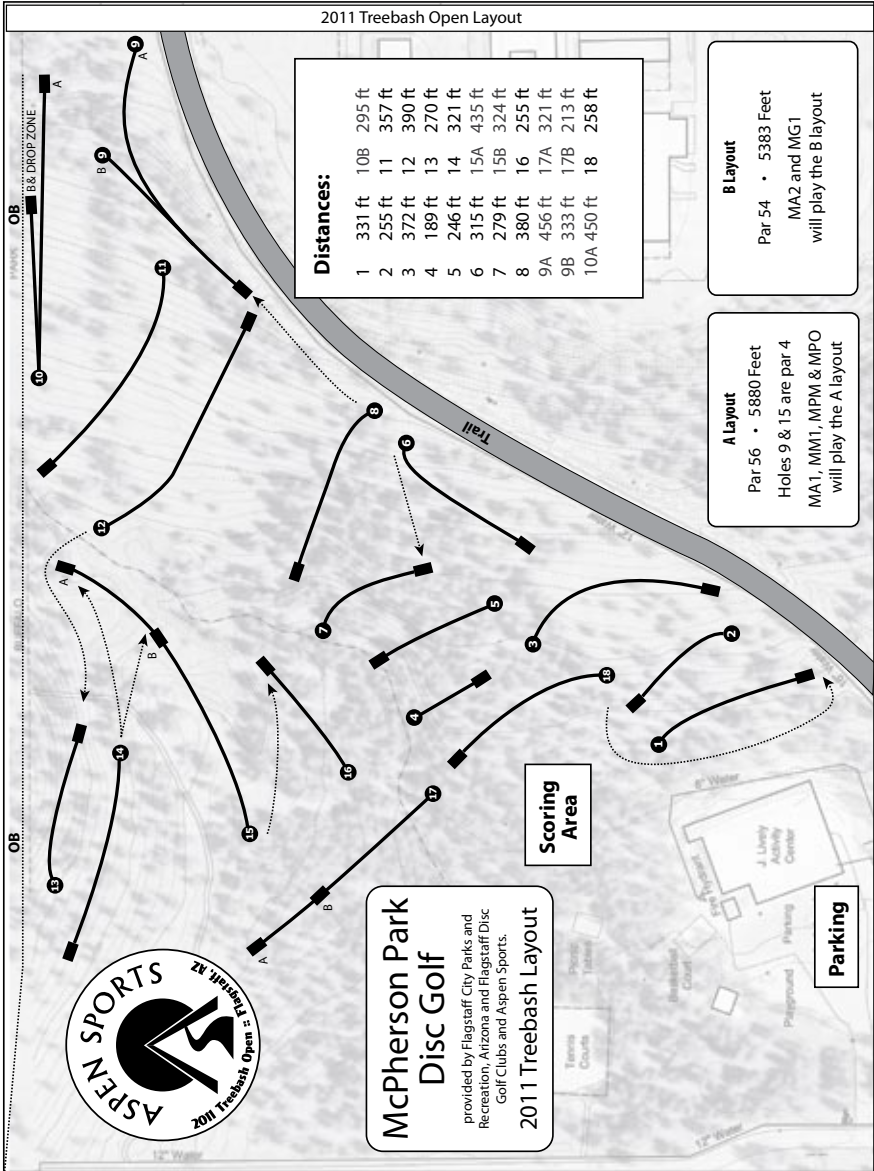

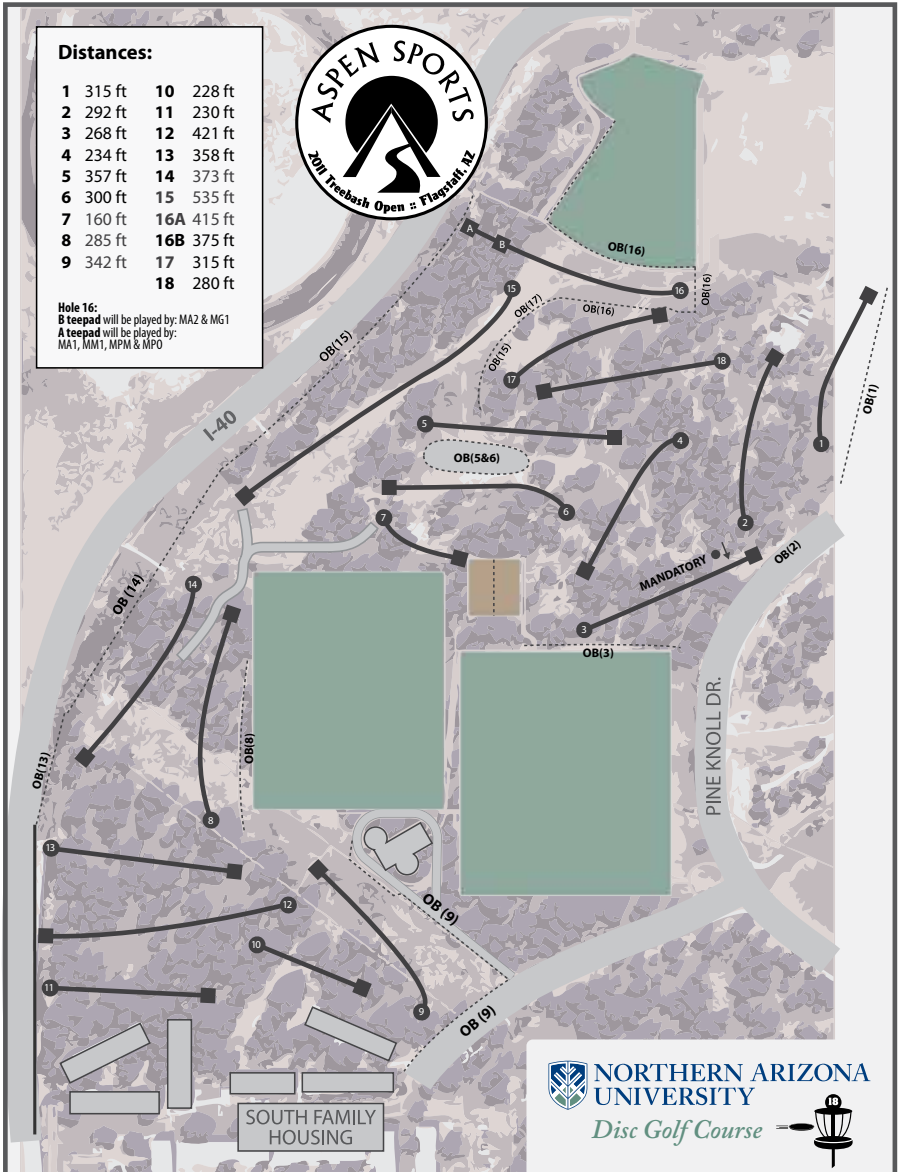
Notes on the McPherson Park Course:

Spectacular views of the San Francisco Peaks situated on the historic Beale wagon trail make McPherson the most scenic of the in-town courses. New for this year are two pin placements on holes 8 & 10. Hole 8's basket is tucked in near a group of trees on the upper right of the fairway at 380ft uphill and offers a few distinct routes through the fairway. The new location for hole 10 is settled about 30 ft from the long OB fenceline that spans the entire length of the fairway. This hole includes a special rule that gives the player, after taking a penalty stroke, the option of teeing from the short teepad as a drop zone in the case of an out-of-bounds throw.



Notes on the NAU Course:

The Northern Arizona University Course is now in its third design due to additions to the NAU recreational facilities. This challenging course offers a diversity of shot selection, lots of elevation change, out-of-bounds, and technical risk-reward situations. A fair amount of mandatories and out-of-bounds situations will add to the course layout. An out-of-bounds line that spans three holes (15-17) is in place to demand even more accuracy from the players. An inaugural OB island of rocks on holes 5 & 6 will further test the throwers' skills. Also, new for this year is a long teepad for hole 16 that some divisions will play.

Directions from Downtown Flagstaff to McPherson Park:

North on San Francisco past Hospital. Right at stoplight on Forest. Left at stoplight on Turquoise, right into parking lot. Overflow parking on the north side of Turquoise.

Directions from Downtown Flagstaff to NAU Course:

South on Beaver St. to Left on Butler. Right on San Francisco through Campus. Right on Pine Knoll, left into parking lot P62 after soccer field.

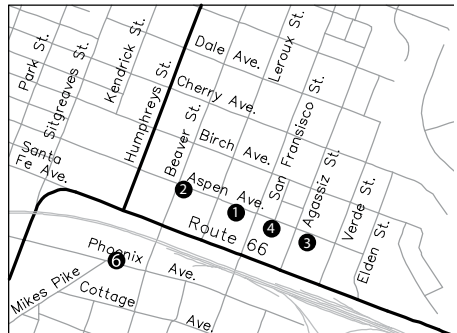

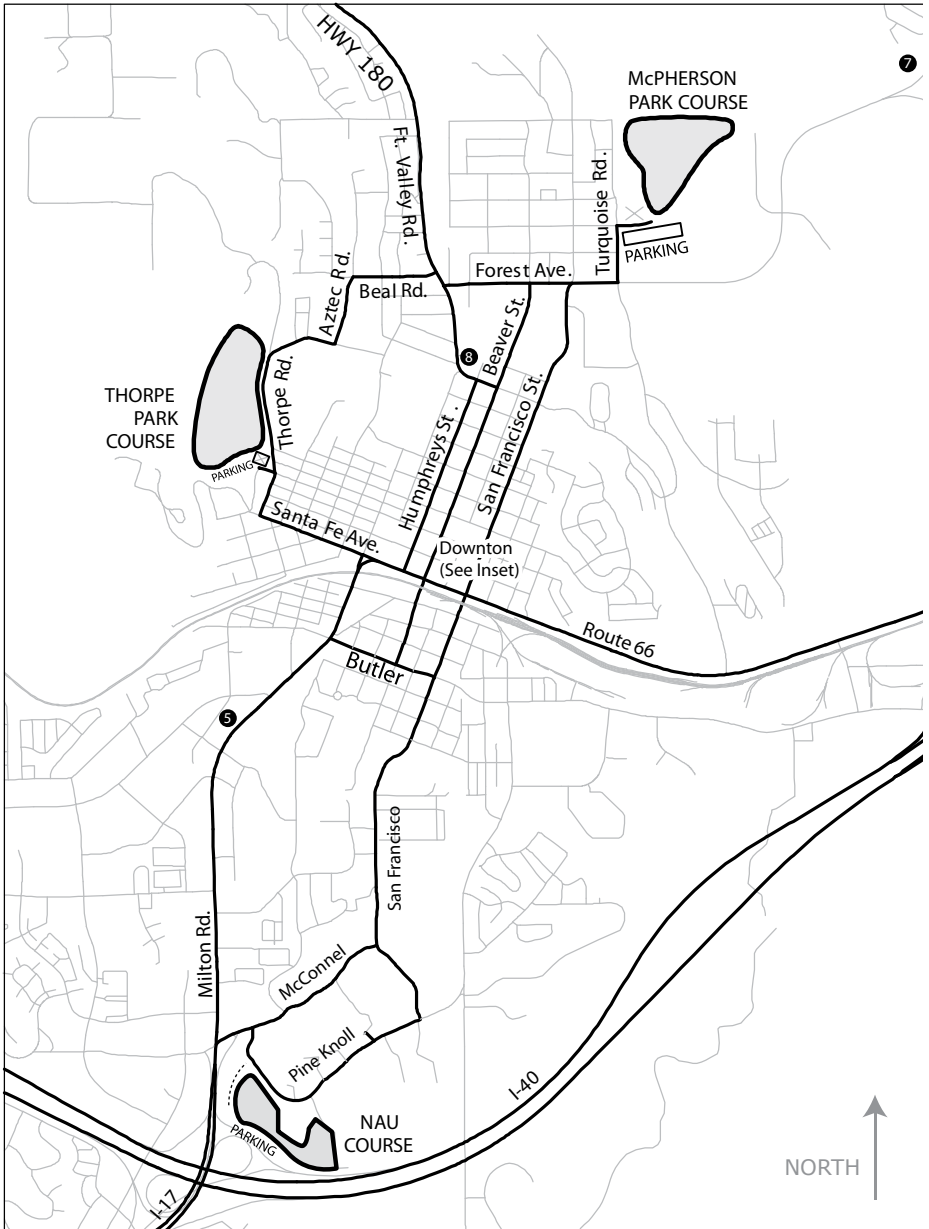

COURSE NOTES

NAU:

- #1: Left of fence is Out-of-Bounds
- #2: Sidewalk and beyond is Out-of-Bounds
- #3: Mandatory left of marked tree *If mandatory is missed, player must add one stroke penalty and throw from the previous lie. Left of fence is Out-of-Bounds
- #5 & 6: Roped off area around rocks is Out-of-Bounds
- #7: Soccer Field (Green) is Out-of-Bounds
- #8: Left of fence is Out-of-Bounds & Soccer Field (Green) is Out-of-Bounds
- #9: All concrete curbs and sidewalks, fence and beyond is Out-of-Bounds
- #10 - #13: Extend all courtesy to tenants of the adjacent apartments, over fence on #13 is Out-of-Bounds
- #14: Left of fence is Out-of-Bounds
- #15: Left of fence & Right of roped area is Out-of-Bounds (see map)
- #16: Left of concrete curb, beyond roped area are all Out-of-Bounds (see map)
B layout plays from the short teepad. A layout plays from the long teepad.
- #17: Right and/or beyond roped area is Out-of-Bounds (see map)

McPherson Park:

- #9: B layout plays to short pin straight ahead.
A layout plays to temporary pin to extreme right in rock.
- #10: B layout plays from the short teepad. A layout plays from the long teepad.
Right of String along fenceline is Out-of-Bounds

**SPECIAL RULE: If a player's disc has landed Out-of-Bounds on hole #10 at McPherson, refer to rule 803.09 Out-of-Bounds, AND the player has the option of taking the subsequent lie on the short teepad.*
- #13: Over fence right is Out-of-Bounds. Make sure green is clear before teeing off.
- #15 & 17: B layout plays from the short teepad. A layout plays from the long teepad.
Watch for pedestrians near green.

From #18 to #1: Walk behind the #2 teepad and to the right of the #1 fairway near the activity center.

from the PDGA rulebook:

803.09 Out-of-Bounds

A. A disc shall be considered out-of-bounds only when it comes to rest and it is clearly and completely surrounded by the out-of-bounds area. A disc thrown in water shall be deemed to be at rest once it is floating or is moving only by the action of the water or the wind on the water. See section 803.03 F. The out-of-bounds line itself is considered out-of--bounds. In order to consider the disc as out-of-bounds, there must be reasonable evidence that the disc came to rest within the out-of-bounds area. In the absence of such evidence, the disc will be considered lost and the player will proceed according to rule 803.11B.

B. A player whose disc is considered out-of-bounds shall receive one penalty throw. The player may elect to play the next shot from: (1) The previous lie as evidenced by the marker disc or, if the marker disc has been moved from an approximate lie, as agreed to by the majority of the group or an official; or (2) A lie that is up to one meter away from and perpendicular to the point where the disc last crossed into out-of-bounds, as determined by a majority of the group or an official. This holds true even if the direction takes the lie closer to the hole; or (3) Within the designated Drop Zone, if provided. These options may be limited by the tournament director as a special condition (see 804.01).

C. The Rule of Verticality. The out-of-bounds line represents a vertical plane. Where a player's lie is marked from a particular point within one meter of the out-of-bounds line pursuant to the rules, the one-meter relief may be taken from the particular point upward or downward along the vertical plane.

D. If the in-bounds status of a disc is uncertain, either a majority of the group or an official shall make the determination. If the thrower moves the disc before a determination has been made, the disc shall be considered out-of-bounds, and he or she shall proceed in accordance with 803.09 B counting all throws made prior to the determination of the in-bounds status of the original lie. If a player other than the thrower moves the disc before a determination has been made, the disc shall be considered in-bounds, and play for the thrower and the mover of the disc shall proceed under the rules of interference, 803.07 B and C.
